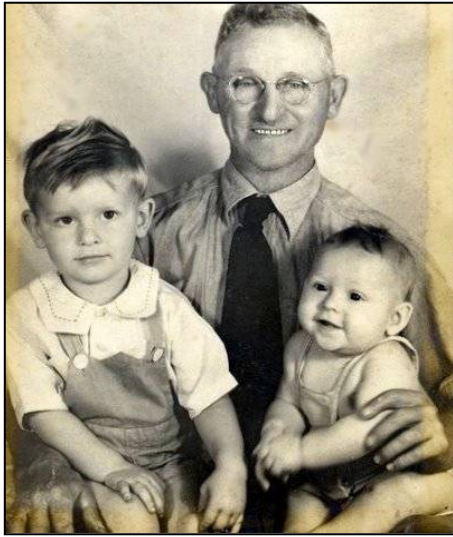

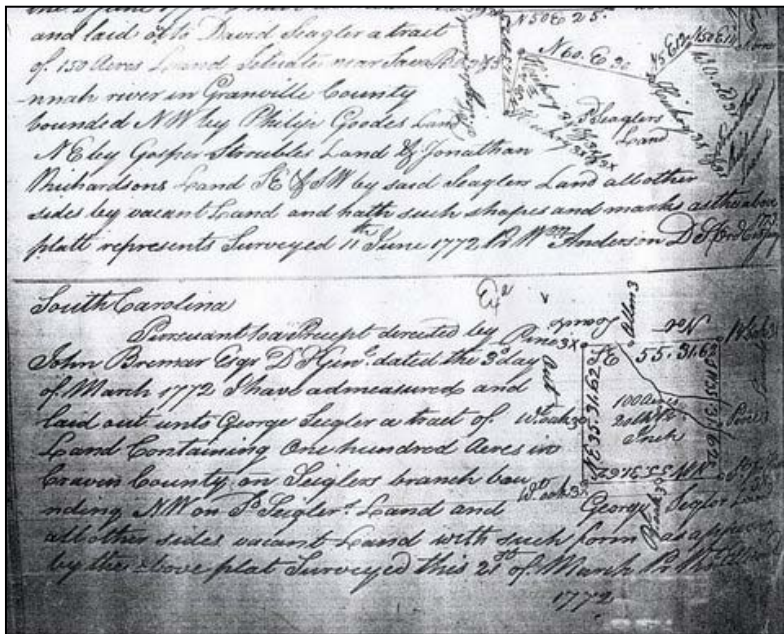
SOUTH-CAROLINA.

GEORGE the *third* by the Grace of God, of GREAT-BRITAIN, FRANCE and IRELAND, KING, Defender of the Faith, and so forth, TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING: KNOW YE, THAT WE, of our special Grace, certain Knowledge and mere Motion, have given and granted, and by these Presents, for us our heirs and successors, DO GIVE AND GRANT unto *George Seigler his* heirs and assigns, a plantation or tract of land containing *one hundred acres* on a Branch of *Wilkinson Creek* known by the Name of *Wilkinson Creek* bounded *South Westward on Conrad Hunter's Land, and on all other sides on vacant Land.*

And hath such shape, form and marks, as appear by a plat thereof, herewith annexed: Together with all woods, under-woods, timber and timber-trees, lakes, ponds, fishings, waters, water-courses, profits, commodities, appurtenances and hereditaments whatsoever, thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining: Together with privilege of hunting, hawking and fowling in and upon the same, and all mines and minerals whatsoever; faving and relieving, nevertheless, to us, our heirs and successors, all white pine-trees, if any thereof should be found growing thereon; and also faving and relieving, nevertheless, to us, our heirs and successors, one tenth-part of mines of gold and silver only: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the said tract of *one hundred* acres of land and all and singular other the premises hereby granted unto the said *George Seigler his* heirs and assigns for ever, in free and common socage, to the said *George Seigler his* heirs and assigns, or to our Receiver-General for the time being, or to his Deputy or Deputies for the time being, yearly, that is to say, on every twenty-fifth day of March, at the rate of three fillings sterling, or four fillings proclamation money, for every hundred acres, and so in proportion, according to the quantity of acres, contained herein; the same to grow due and to be accounted for *from the date hereof* - *Provided always*, and this present Grant is upon condition, nevertheless, that *he* the said *George Seigler his* heirs or assigns, shall and do, yearly, and every year, from and after the date of these presents, clear and cultivate at the rate of *three* acres for every hundred acres of land, and so in proportion according to the quantity of acres herein contained; and also shall and do enter a minute or docket of this our letters patent in the office of our Auditor-General for the time being, in our said Province, within *three* months from the date hereof; and upon condition, that if the said rent, hereby referred, shall happen to be in arrear and unpaid for the space of *three* years from the time it shall become due, and no distress can be found on the said lands, tenements and hereditaments hereby granted; or if the said *George Seigler his* heirs or assigns shall neglect to clear and cultivate yearly and every year, at the rate of *three* acres for every hundred acres of land, and so in proportion, according to the quantity of acres herein contained, or if a minute or docket of these our letters patent, shall not be entered in the office of our Auditor-General for the time being, within *three* months from the date hereof, that then and in any of these cases, this present Grant shall cease, and determine and be utterly void; and the said land, tenements and hereditaments hereby granted, and every part and parcel thereof, shall revert to us, our heirs and successors, as fully and absolutely, as if the same had never been granted. PROVIDED ALSO, if the said land hereby mentioned to be granted shall happen to be within the bounds or limits of any Township, or of the lands reserved for the use of the Townships now laid out in our said Province, in pursuance of our Royal Instructions; that then this Grant shall be void, any thing herein to the contrary contained notwithstanding.

And hath such shape, form and marks, as appear by a plat thereof, herewith annexed: Together with all woods, under-woods, timber and timber-trees, lakes, ponds, fishings, waters, water-courses, profits, commodities, appurtenances and hereditaments whatsoever, thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining: Together with privilege of hunting, hawking and fowling in and upon the same, and all mines and minerals whatsoever; faving and relieving, nevertheless, to us, our heirs and successors, all white pine-trees, if any thereof should be found growing thereon; and also faving and relieving, nevertheless, to us, our heirs and successors, one tenth-part of mines of gold and silver only: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the said tract of *one hundred* acres of land and all and singular other the premises hereby granted unto the said *George Seigler his* heirs and assigns for ever, in free and common socage, to the said *George Seigler his* heirs and assigns, or to our Receiver-General for the time being, or to his Deputy or Deputies for the time being, yearly, that is to say, on the twenty-fifth day of March, in every year, at the rate of three fillings sterling, or four fillings proclamation money, for every hundred acres, and so in proportion according to the quantity of acres, contained herein; the same to commence at the expiration of *one* year from the date hereof. *Provided always*, and this present Grant is upon condition, nevertheless, that the said *George Seigler his* heirs or assigns, shall and do, yearly, and every year, after the date of these presents, clear and cultivate at the rate of *three* acres for every hundred acres of land, and so in proportion, according to the number of acres herein contained; and also shall and do enter a minute or docket of this our letters patent in the office of our Auditor-General for the time being, in our said Province, within *three* months from the date hereof; and upon condition, that if the said rent, hereby referred, shall happen to be in arrear and unpaid for the space of *three* years from the time it shall become due, and no distress can be found on the said lands, tenements and hereditaments hereby granted; or if the said *George Seigler his* heirs or assigns shall neglect to clear and cultivate yearly and every year, at the rate of *three* acres for every hundred acres of land, and so in proportion, according to the number of acres herein contained, or if a minute or docket of these our letters patent, shall not be entered in the office of our Auditor-General for the time being, within *three* months from the date hereof, that then and in any of these cases, this present Grant shall cease, and determine and be utterly void; and the said land, tenements and hereditaments hereby granted, and every part and parcel thereof, shall revert to us, our heirs and successors, as fully and absolutely, as if the same had never been granted.

GEORGE SEIGLER

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN; I George Seigler Senior of Fairfield District; and state of South Carolina; being far advanced in years and weak in body, but of sound mind and understanding; and considering the uncertainty of this mortal life; Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament; Principally and First of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body I commit to the earth, To be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named; And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased god to bless me on this life; ---- I Give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form; Inprimis It is my will and pleasure that my Plantation whereon I now live containing one hundred acres---Including Forty five acres in a tract of One hundred and Forty five acres of Land adjoining, Owen otherwise called Wilkenson's creek, the aforesaid Tract and John Mathews land; which make in the whole One hundred and Forty five acres; Shall be possessed by my daughter Prifsella Ogilvie during her natural Life; --- Item I give devise and Bequeath One Hundred acres of Land; more or less; Bounded by my spring Branch on the Northeast and on Southwest by Land held by the Heirs of Richard Strother Dec^d also a Certain Sorrel mare and Two cows and calves, which I estimate to be worth Twenty pounds Sterling money of the State aforesaid to my Beloved son George Seigler Junior his heirs and assigns Forever -----Item I give and Bequeath to my Second Daughter Judith Seigler One hundred acres of Land granted to Lewis Owen, adjoining John and Philip Mathews Land. on the Northeast and my spring Branch on the South West For ever; ----- Item where as it is my hearty wish and desire to do as equal Justice as possible to my Children; and Grand Children; and to Dispose of my Property as I think most proper; Therefore it is souls desire that after the Decease of my Daughter ---- Prifsilla Ogilvie; should her son Minor Seigler be then alive & Take the necessary charge of his Brother and Sisters until they arrive to the years of

maturity; Then and in that case; he the said Minor Seigler, shall be fully Intituled to the aforesaid tract of Land lent to my Daughter Prifsella Ogilvie during life; to him For ever; Otherwise should Minor Seigler Decease, before the Commencement of aforesaid Term it is ment that the above : said Tract of One Hundred and Forty five acres of Land shall be kept for the Support and raising of my Daughter Prifsella Ogilvie children untill they arrive to the years of maturity after which my request and desire; is that my Executors shall have the Land Set up and Sold at Publick auction; giving twelve months Credit; and the moneys, arising there from Equally to be destrubuted. Share, and Share, a like, amongst the Children of my Daughter Prifsilla Ogilvie; -----Item it is my Will and pleasure that all my Household _ Furniture, Plantation Tools, and Stock of every kind whatsoever Shall be sold; & all my Lawful Debts paid. and Selled after which the Balance that remains wish to be Equally and proportionally Devided amongst my Children; first noticing the property estimated and given to my Son ----George Seigler J^r -----Lastly I do hereby appoint my Beloved Son George Seigler John Mathews and John Pearson the property estimated and given to my Son ----George Seigler J^r -----Lastly I do hereby appoint my Beloved Son George Seigler John Mathews and John Pearson Sen.^r Executors of this my Will; revoking all former wills and Executors; and confirming this to be my Last will and Testament; In Witnefs whereof I the Said George Seigler have hereunto Set my hand and Seal this 18th day of February Anno Domini 1808 -----
